Central Africa Committed Church According to Bishop Sawuti, the church split off from the Dutch Reformed Church in Zimbabwe during the time of the independence struggle, when some church members felt their leadership was too closely connected to the policies of white rule. Worship closely resembles the RCZ (hymn-book, Bible). (The UCZ was formed in 1965 out of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, the Church of Scotland, The London Missionary Society (LMS), the Paris Evangelical Mission, the Presbyterian Church, the Free Church in Central Africa and the Free Church of the Copperbelt. A <i>Society</i> has less than 40 members; an <i>Outpost</i> less than 20, and an <i>Opening</i> less than 10). Each local church looks after their own ministers. They pray in the house of one of the faithful and are presently looking for a plot to build their own church. In the past they prayed in the school, but were late to pay. | 24. New Zion Apostolic Church Started in Bauleni by Busa Chiwele after a severe sickness. Was diagnosed to have the <i>mzimu</i> Yakobe. Did extensive traveling in South Africa and Zimbabwe. He started first a Zion church in Woodlands, before moving to Bauleni around 1991. Follow the Zion rites (taking off the shoes, kneeling towards the East, at times each one praying in his own way, songs, laying on hands on the sick and possessed towards the end of the service.) Prayer and fasting. Go sometimes “to the mountain” to pray and fast there day and night. Baptism by immersion in Chalimbana river. Do not heal much with medicines, but with holy water, salt and prayers. HQ of the Paradise Spirit Church for Zambia is in Mandevu (bishop, also called senior pastor), who gives written authority to start a branch. There are 72 or more branches in Zambia (Lusaka, Chipata, Livingstone, Kabwe, Kapiri Mposhi, Mkushi, Ndola). According to Mama Josephe, the Paradise Spirit church emerged from the Central Spirit Church which itself emerged from Zion Spirit Church during “a time of confusion”. The Bauleni Word of God Ministries was founded by several young men who had been expelled (with many others) from the Catholic church due to clashes concerning charismatic prayers, and later on also from the Pentecostal Holiness church. They first prayed in pastor Phiri’s house, until they built their own church in 1995. | 28. Central African Spirit Church (1994-2007) United Holy Spirit Church (2007-) A Zion church lead by Doctor Maria, who was before a member of the Paradise Spirit Church. They pray behind the house of Maria in a small shelter. In 2007 she became affiliated to the HQ in Chipata East (Kaulembe) and changed to United Holy Spirit church. | 30. Christ Gospel (1995-2003) Hope in Christ (2003 -) A Bauleni-born Pentecostal church with branches in Linda, Chawama and Ng'ombe compounds. Goes back to a church called Christ Gospel (founded in 1995), which disintegrated in 2003. The new pastor who took over the congregation that year (pastor Phiri) decided to change the name so as to give it a new start. They pray for the sick and possessed, but emphasis also hospital treatment. Trinitarian baptism by immersion in the Chalimbana river. Built a new church this year in Bauleni (before that they prayed in a shelter). | 33. Glorious Salvation Ministries A Bauleni-born Pentecostal church founded by bishop Katobemo. During his childhood, bishop Katobemo was Catholic. After a sickness that was cured in a Zion church, he joined the Central African Spirit Church, in which he became a leading member. He also worked closely with other churches in the Zion (<i>mizimu</i>) tradition: Paradise Spirit and Mutumwa. He tried to reform the Zion churches, stressing accountability for the donations, fees and gifts received by the prophets. He was moving towards a more Pentecostal tradition, and wanted to take the whole of the Central African Spirit church along. It came to clashes, and at one point Bishop Katobemo was refused entry in his Zion church in Bauleni, since he refused to take off his shoes. After the clash and split, Bishop Katobemo broke with the Zion tradition and embraced a Pentecostal faith. | 34. Jesus Ministries Bauleni-born church in the charismatic tradition founded by bishop Harry Mcheka. "I was a Jehovah Witness and challenged God by putting my finger on the Bible (Ex 15) when my wife was very sick and when our children kept dying: 'If your word truly lives, then heal my wife.' My wife got cured and my children stopped dying. God had proven himself to me! Baptist Church (A)</p> <p>Bauleni Baptist Church is part of the BFZ (Baptist Faith of Zambia) which was formed in 1995/96 together with 130 other churches out of the Baptist Convention of Zambia, which by then was 550 churches strong. It is based on the Southern Baptists who came to Zambia in 1959 (Zed Moss and Tom Small). They started Chamboli Baptist Church on the Copperbelt in 1960, and Matero Baptist church in 1961. (The Northern Baptists started in 1913). | <p>37. New Christian Salvation Ministries</p> <p>A Bauleni-born autonomous Pentecostal church. The founder (pastor Bengo) had been in the Central African Spirit Church for 13 years where he held a leading position (Lusaka Provincial Secretary). He broke away from the Zion tradition, and from keeping a relationship with a <i>mzimu</i> spirit in 1995, when he embraced the Pentecostal faith in the Glorious Salvation Ministries (see above), where bishop Katobemo had undergone a similar experience. In 1997 he left the church to form his own autonomous Pentecostal church, after feeling a calling to be a pastor, to pray for the sick, to lead people to God and care about daily living with Christ. The name reflects that “we are newly born in Christ and we are saved by the Lord”. They are looking for a plot in Bauleni to build their own church. Christian Apostolic Ministries</p> <p>Two small but packed churches in the Zion tradition, both lead by the same pastor residing in Bauleni (Branch B was lead for some time by another pastor who left to another church). Founder: Bishop Stephen Phiri, who resides at the HQ in New Chibolya (Lusaka). Belong to Zion Apostolic Church. Branches in Bauleni, Chawama, Khukhu, Kanyama, Kalikiliki and Chipata. Training of Bauleni pastor: 2 months course at Campus Crucade (besides UNZA), before being ordained by Bishop Phiri. The pastors are encouraged to do further training by themselves. Prayers according to Zion tradition (no shoes, kneeling and simultaneous prayers while facing the east, long songs with clapping and dancing, sometimes drumming, trance, exorcism at the end of service sometimes with holy water and sometimes with water, ashes and garlic.) But no explicit references to specific <i>mizimu</i>. Hierarchically structured: General Overseer (spiritual head), mothers of Israel, national elders, regional coordinators, provincial pastors, area pastors, pastors, deacons and deaconesses, unordained ministers, workers, baptised members, saved unbaptised members, newcomers. 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| <p>umbrella of the related churches; “East Gate Revival Centre” is the specific name of the Bauleni branch (the name comes from Ezekiel’s prophesy of the water of healing flowing out of the east gate of the Temple of Jerusalem). The East Gate Revival Centre started as a House Cell in the Cooperative College of the Libala HQ (1997) which grew into a church in Bauleni in 1999. Packed classroom with many people outside; they are building now their own church in Bauleni with a capacity for 800 people. Some members of Bauleni branch come from State Lodge, and a few from as far as Cawama, Makeni, and John Howard. The Revival Fire Ministries started as an indigenous church by Rev. Chipaya with help from pastors of the USA. Branches in Mongu, Kasama, Kitwe and 4 in Lusaka. Beliefs: “We have to be Christ-like; anything less is not Christian. In our way of life people must recognize Christ.” Belief in blessings and healing in a holistic approach (body, soul and spirit): “Jesus did not pray for empty stomachs but he gave food”. Thus they took over a community school and are building a community centre. | <p>44. Pentecostal Assemblies of God (PAOG). Have built their own church this year; before that they were praying in the Basic School. Roots: USA (Pentecostal revival beginning 20th cent). Aim at implanting self-supporting and self-propagating communities. Web (USA): http://www.paga.org/ In Zambia, PAOG started in 1957 (Northmead, Maranatha & Chawama), and was predominantly a missionary church run by expatriates until 1974, which was the start of a Bible college for PAOG pastors. In 2002, PAOG counted 11,600 adult members in Lusaka. | <p>48. Mutima Church (of Emilio Mulolani). Founded 1954, when many members were drawn especially from the Catholic Church. The founder (Emilyo Mulolani) was a former seminarian aspiring for the priesthood in the Catholic church. Mary “the mother of the creator” is seen as part of the godhead, as was revealed to the founder. Africans receive a special love from Mary, as the Biblical Jacob received a special love and blessings from Rebecca. Belief in the “Quintity” within the Trinity, in which the male and female principles are united. Prayers on Saturday in Bemba (without shoes), consisting of litanies and songs of praise, kneeling, sitting (on the floor), standing and dancing. During the prayer a number of statements of faith are explained by various members (including children) in a brief way which are taken up by the congregation in standard greetings. Fellow members are greeted in a special way (<i>kucinkula</i>). Most members wear their proper vestments during the prayer services: blue for the celibate leaders (<i>mubile</i>), brown for the married priests (<i>nkonkani</i>), green for other members. Speakers hold a staff of authority. No national HQ but various <i>misumba</i> called <i>Namfumumu</i>. The Lusaka HQ (Namfumumu) is in Chazanga. With healing and deliverance, but no dancing, drumming or clapping. The Zambian branches are lead by Pastor Timothy Kaibula. Before the prayer services people gather in silent prayer for the service. Requests for prayers and healing are read out aloud before the congregation. Different people give free testimonies. At the end of the prayer, people come in front (sanctuary). No collection.
